

Frequently Asked Questions

1. Why do I need to get a physical for my student every year?

In order to maintain up-to-date records, Campbell Hall requires a Physical Clearance Form to be filled out annually for all students. This helps ensure the safety of your student while on retreats, during off-campus sports, and if an emergency occurs (this also includes elementary).

2. Our insurance won't cover my student's physical appointment before June 15th because it has not been a year since their last physical. What do I do?

First, please complete the remaining Magnus Health requirements electronically. Once this is complete, email the Health Office at healthoffice@campbellhall.org with the date of when your student's physical appointment will take place.

Include the reason for the late physical.

NOTE: Late physical approval will vary depending on individual circumstance.

3. Why is vision screening required for grades K,2,5, and 8?

Vision screening is required by California Law 494521 upon first enrollment and at least every third year after until child has completed 8th grade.

6. Can I fill out one medication form for multiple medications?

No. Each medication requires its own form.
NOTE: Prescription Medication Forms must be signed or stamped by the physician prescribing the medication.

7. Once a Medication Consent Form is signed by a physician and submitted, do I need to submit an additional form for field trips?

No. Any consent form submitted to the Health Office or uploaded to Magnus Health is valid for the remaining school year for that particular medication.

8. Why do I need a new action plan signed by the doctor every year?

A doctor's order is only valid for ONE year due to California law.

9. Do returning students need to submit immunization records?

If your student is all caught up and did not receive a new vaccination this year, there is no need to submit immunization records as they are already on file.

10. Not sure if your student is caught up on their immunizations? Here are some questions to ask your student's physician.

Is my student updated on all immunizations?

If not, what are they missing?

Which vaccines require more than 1 dose?

What happens if my child is late getting a dose?

If my student is entering 7th grade, have they received the required Tdap vaccination?
