MATHEMATICS PLACEMENT (All NEW to CH Students)

The IN PERSON Math Placement Exam will take place on Tuesday, April 29 from 4:30-5:30pm.

The purpose of this examination is to provide the mathematics department with additional information for math placement. The department will also look at report cards, student narratives, standardized test scores and teacher recommendations. All incoming students are required to take an in-person math placement test so we can ensure appropriate placement. No preparation is necessary.

Please note:

- The in-person placement test on 4/29 is specifically hosted for New-to-CH students.
- Current CH students will take their math placement tests during elementary school hours.

- World language online placement testing is **required** for all students who seek a placement **beyond the beginning level** in their chosen world language.
- Students who do not have previous experience with the language they choose (and students who would like to start their middle school study at the beginning level even with some prior experience) will enroll in the **beginning course.**
